

Esquire late Sheriff of Greenville in the State aforesaid did  
 by his voluntary act and deed in writing release and convey  
 in fee simple certain tracts or parcels or plantations of lands sita-  
 ted in the District of Greenville, therein more particularly set  
 forth for the express purpose of the better securing of the said  
 Nimrod Underwood securities as Sheriff aforesaid and giving  
 and granting to his said securities full power and authority to  
 sell either at public or private sale any of the said Underwood  
 lands that he then owned and therein mentioned in the  
 authority given by him the said Underwood to sell the said  
 lands or any part thereof, which instrument of writing was  
 drawn by Wardy Thompson Esq. Jr. Attorney at law the said  
 Underwood's attorney generally the said instrument bearing date  
 the 10 day day of November 1827. and which is recorded in  
 the Clerk's office of the said District. Now know ye that  
 to John Young, Thomas Benson, Alexander Waddell Thomas  
 Wynne, Ezekiel J. Salmon, the legal representative of Wheaton  
 Merrill dec'd. John Hodges, George Russell, And Curtis Bradley  
 the legal representative of A.D. Bradley etc being the securities  
 of the said Nimrod Underwood have for and in consideration  
 of the sum of four hundred dollars to us paid by John  
 Shockley of the District and State aforesaid have granted  
 bargained, sold and released and by these presents grant  
 bargain sell and release unto the said John Shockley all that cer-  
 -tain piece parcel or tract of land lying and being in the distri-  
 ct aforesaid on the east side of Rudy River and bounded as  
 follows, beginning on a maple at the ford of Rudy River thence  
 down the main stream to Robert Duncan's maple corner thence  
 an eastwardly course a conditional line to Charles Benson's  
 old original line thence up the said line to a post oak corner  
 thence taking a long John Harrison's old line to a Hickory  
 corner on the road thence down the said road as it meanders  
 to the maple corner the beginning part of three original surveys  
 are originally laid out to Charles Benson, one to John Corr  
 and one to John Harrison bounded on the lower or south  
 side by Robert Duncan, Eastwardly John Moore and  
 Northwardly by John Hawkins containing by estimation  
 two hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less which  
 was conveyed to him by Joshua Hawkins by deed bearing  
 date 20 Decr. 1816. And recorded in register of mesne
