 the same more or less to have and to hold all and singular the wood
 water and water courses profit privatages hereditaments and
 appurtenances and what soever belonging to the aforesaid
 premises, I the said Thomas McCarrill do warrant and ever defend
 the aforesaid premises unto John Hodges and his heirs for ever from
