 to the same, sworn to and subscribed this 17th July 1830 Before
 H. Cobb J. L. G. W. Sullivan

South Carolina. Gunville District. Whereas Hiram Whitted the acting
 Executor of the late will of Micajah Pickett deceased have had
 and made many liabilities by receiving large portions or sums
 of money by reason of his Executorship under said Estate also
 Hisannah Pickett has and did obtain a decree against said
 estate under which decree Elizabeth Mobley was and is a Clai-
 -mant and whereas Hiram Whitted had and did receive
 under the will of Micajah Pickett Pickett deceased a
 negro Boy boy by the name of Rock at the price of four
 hundred and fifty dollars which Boy Rock was and is placed
 to the credit of Elizabeth Mobley now be it known to all persons
 whom it may concern that I Samuel Mobley doth hereby
 agree that he doth hereby recover from Thomas J. Doolan
 four hundred and fifty dollars with Interest thereon from
 the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and
 seventy three which is in part of the portion that was and is due
 to my wife Elizabeth Mobley under said decree, which sum of mo-
 -ney is here by forever Relinquished by me and my heirs unto Susan
 Whitted now Susan Doolan as the portion that would have been due
 to Hiram Whitted also I Samuel Mobley doth here by Relinquish
 and forever release unto Thomas J. Doolan all of my right and
 interest and all claim to the late will of Hiram Whitted deceased
 also I bind my heirs also to release and relinquish all claim to
 the said will, also I Samuel Mobley doth hereby Revoke all
 power of attorney that I ever made to Hiram Whitted de-
 ceased to transact any business for me whatsoever all of which
 ever to be stoped and of no effect as witness hereunto I doth set
 my hand affix my seal this 18th day of February 1830

 Also I Samuel Mobley doth receive from Hiram Whitted
 in or about the year 1820 his bond for seven hundred
 and fifty dollars which bond is misplaced or lost be it known
