unto the Dr. Thomas Masters his heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby  
bind myself my heirs and assigns to warrant and for ever defend  
the title of said Land unto the Dr. Thomas Masters his heirs and assigns -  
against myself my heirs or any other Person lawfully claiming the  
same whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty  
fifth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand  
Eighty-and-twenty nine and the fifty third year of the Independence

presents that I George Ward of Granville District for and in consideration  
of five hundred dollars to me paid by Jonathan Ward of the State and  
District aforesaid HAVE granted bargained sold and released and by  
these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Jonathan Ward  
a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the district aforesaid  
on both sides of South Pacolet River begining on a Hickory corner  
near the head of the falling spring there along a conditional line  
crossing the said River so as to run about half way between  
the upper end of the plantation and a small field on said River  
that is at or near the foot of the mountain and to continue the  
same course to the back line and then with it as it is laid out  
by a plat or plats representing the same round to the begining it be-  
ing the lower end of the land wherein Richard formerly  
lived and lying next above lands belonging to Silas R.
