Know all men by these presents that I, Eliza Hanner of Greenville District in the State aforesaid for & in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by John W. Bredlove of the State and District aforesaid HAVE GRANTED bargained sold and released and do by these presents grant bargain sell and release unto the said John W. Bredlove a certain parcel or tract of land lying in the District and State aforesaid on the waters or branches of Morgans Creek beginning on a red Oak bush a corner between William Butler and John Mason running thence E. 37 ch. to a Chestnut a corner of the Land whereon William Johnson now lives thence S. 65. E. 6 ch 50 ch. to a post oak old corner thence N. 21. W. 34 ch 25 ch. to a post oak near Goodgins corner 37. thence N. 55. W. 5 ch 40 ch. to a Chestnut 37 between William Butler & the said Land thence S. 55. W. 23 ch to a red Oak by a road thence S. 24 W. 20 ch to the beginning supposed to contain Eighty four Acres be the same more or less it being part of a survey originally granted to Robert Goodgins which land was conveyed to David Barnett to Eliza Hanner from Eliza Hanner unto Jacob Land and from the said Land unto the said Eliza Hanner and from the said Eliza Hanner unto John W. Bredlove Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances unto the said Bredlove him and his heirs for ever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular or the premises before mentioned unto the said Bredlove from me and my heirs and all persons whomsoever claiming the same or any part thereof
