Know all me by these presents that John Naughton of the District of Spartanburgh and State of South Carolina have leased my land to Dennis Marshall of the District and State above named for the use and purpose of mowing together with such timber, water and other appertinances as may be required to carry on the mowing business on or in said land for the term of five years said land lying and being partly in in Spartanburgh and partly in Greenville for and in consideration of which said Marshall does bind himself to pay said Naughton fifty Dollars for the first year or at that rate for the term of time he works if less than a year and one hundred Dollars or at that rate for the time he works that is one hundred Dollars a year, If said Marshall finds the mowth not worth mowing, for he is to give up the Lease August the 10th 1830 - John Naughton

Smith of the State of South Carolina Greenville District of one part and Alexander McKenny of the same State and District afore mentioned of the other part witnesseth that Mecajah J. Smith for the inconsideration of the sum of Three Hundred Dollars in hand paid me Alexander McKenny the receipt is hereby acknowledged that bargained sold and delivered and do by these presents bargain sell and unto Alexander McKenny two certain tracts of land lying and being in Greenville District on both sides of the middle fork of Saluda river and a branch of it to wit say one tract containing one hundred and fifty acres Granted to Tho. Wood the third of April one thousand
