the sum of eighty dollars to me paid by Thos. Chiles of the District  
aforesaid the receipt is hereby acknowledged have granted, bargained  
& conveyed unto the said Thos. Chiles his heirs or assigns a certain tract  
of land containing one hundred acres more or less situated & being  
in the District of Greenville & State aforesaid on the south side of  
Enoree branch beginning on a stake on Perrys line and runs as  
follows S. to a black oak thence westwards thence S. 42 degrees  
W. to the head of the Cottar Branch thence Northward up the  
hill to a chestnut thence along the ridge to the mouth of the branch  
to a white oak corner thence down said branch to the beginning  
Being part of tract of land granted to Robert Prince which passed  
of one hundred acres of land as aforesaid & unto the said Thos. Chiles  
his heirs and assigns forever against myself my heirs Executors or ad-  
ministrators & against all and every other person whomsoever law-  
fully claiming or any part thereof: In witness whereof I have set  
my hand and seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day January 1831
