130 State of South Carolina 3 This Indenture made this tenth day of December in Greenville district 3 the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two between John Watson ordinary of Greenville district aforesaid and Hiram Cooley of the same state and district Whereas as a summons to divide or sell a certain tract of land herein after described of the Estate of Justice Woodson deceased issued from the Court of Ordinary of said district and upon the return thereof the Judge of said court did determine that the said land could not be divided without injury to the interests of the parties and did order the same to be sold by the Sheriff of the district aforesaid on a credit of one year Whereupon the Sheriff aforesaid did advertise the said land for sale on the first Monday in January A D 1832 and whereas the Sheriff aforesaid did on the said day aforesaid expose to sale at public auction on the credit aforesaid the said land when Hiram Cooley was the last and highest bidder to whom the said land was struck off
