In consideration of the sum of two hundred and sixteen dollars to me in hand
paid by Capt Robert Peden of the district of Greenville in the State of South
Carolina have given granted bargained and sold to the said Robert Peden all
that lot or tract of land in the district of Greenville and State aforesaid on the
waters of Raburns Creek containing one hundred and thirty five acres more or
less it being part of a tract of land which I purchased of John Kelley for a more
particular description of which part hereby intended to be conveyed are fore-
seen is hereby made to a plat thereof hereunto annexed to have and to hold the afo-
resaid tract of land to the said Robert Peden his heirs and assigns forever and
I do hereby warrant and will forever defend all and singular the premises to the
said Robert Peden his heirs and assigns forever against the claim or demand of
all manner of persons whomsoever In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this the 22nd day of January 1833.
