Page 171 the land to be conveyed contains two hundred and thirty acres and begins as follows (viz) Begining on a white oak on the Bank of said River and runs on the original line S. 62° W. 56.00 to a stake 3x on thence back on the original line N. 20° W. 39.00 over Bots Branch to a stake 3x on between said Harris & William Walker thence down the Meanders of said Branch to the mouth of it thence down the Meanders of said River to the begining Water oak which includes the land to be conveyed together with all and singular the rights members Here determinants and appurtenances to the said premises belong, or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Pennel Wood his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Pennel Wood his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other Person whom soever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof witness my hand and seal this fifth day of October in the year of our Lord 1798 and in 23rd year of the Independence of the United States of America Test Henry Wood
