W. 63. chs to a stake Corner thence S. 80. E. 45 chs to a stake Corner thence N. 70. E. 62. 50 chs to a Hickory 37 on the River then up the meanders of the River to the Beginning with the appurtenances thereunto belonging and all the Estate Right Title Interest Claim or demand which the Said Peter Acker deceased at the time of his Death had in or to the Same to have and to hold the Said tract of Land together with all and singular the premises Improvements and appurtenances to the Said Alexander Acker and his heirs and assigns forever In Witness Whereof I the Said John Watson as ordinary aforesaid have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year above mentioned

South Carolina Knows all men by these presents that William Pollard of Greenville District and State aforesaid for and Inconsideration of the Sum of two hundred dollars to me paid by John Pollard William Pollard Benjamin Pollard and Eli Pollard of the district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do Grant bargain and sell unto the Said four Pollards Equally and severally a tract of Land lying and being in the district and State aforesaid on both sides of Kelly River it being part of a tract of Land originally granted to James Mcquilliams by his Excellency Benjamin Gerard on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of January 1785 the Land to be conveyed Beginning at a spring on a white oak below the Shoal on the North Bank thence across the river to area oak near old Store house then running up to Lake Bridge then running then running within thirty feet of said river to Linda mow land on Stake Corner then across the river to Lewis Rodgers Land then down Said River to the mouth of Branch thence to the Beginning Including five acres more or less with the Shoal where the mill stood to have and to hold all and singular the premises before
