Pike a plantation or tract of Land containing Ninety five acres lying
in a branch of Brushy Creek of Eocene River wheras it beginning at
a Red Oak corner thence N 10° 46' E thence W to a Red Oak corner thence
N 68° 34' E to a post Oak corner thence N 68° 34' E to a Black Oak corner
thence N 11' E to a post Oak corner thence N 15° 46' S E to the begining
giving corner also a tract or parcel of Land containing fifty acres
and situated in the State aforesaid and District on a small branch of
Brushy Creek waters of Eocene River bounded on the North by
said first described tract of Land East by William Taylors land
South by William Ferguson beginning at a post Oak corner
the said N 63° 63' E to a black Oak corner thence S 31' to a post Oak corner
of Land thence N 70° W 25' E 50 pds to a post Oak corner thence N 35° 20' S 50'
deed to the beginning post Oak corner together with all and singular
land in the rights, members, inhabitants, and appertaining thereto belonging
with or in any wise incident or appertaining to has and to hold all such
singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Henry Pike his
heirs executors & administrators to warrant & for ever defend all
and singular the premises unto the said Henry Pike his heirs executors
and myself & my heirs and assigns forever whomsoever lawfully
