sum of Eight Hundred dollars to me in hand paid by James  
Anderson Sr of Spartanburgh district and State upon said  
I the said Christopher McCrary have granted bargained  
sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain  
sell and release unto the said James Anderson for all the  
tracts or parcel of Land including the plantation said  
McCrary now lies on containing two Hundred acres of land  
situate in Greenville district and State aforesaid on the  
South Side of Eum River and North Side of Peter Creek -  
beginning on the North bank of said Creek on a Chestnut  
Cormer and runs North 40 West 40 Ch to a Holly oak Cormer  
an Brockman Branch thence down the meanders of said  
branch to a cypress tree Cormer on the South Side of Eum River  
at the mouth of said branch thence down the meanders of  
said River to a Spanish Oak Cormer on the bank of said River  
thence on a marked line running S 30 W 15 Chain to a Iron  
wood Cormer on the North bank of Peter Creek thence up the  
meanders of said Creek to the beginning Chestnut Cormer  
which includes all the Land to be conveyed by the same  
more or less together with all and singular the rights  
members incidents and appurtenances to the said premises  
belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to them  
and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned  
unto the said James Anderson for his heirs and assigns for
