 Love and affection which I bear towards my son Thomas Hudson
 hath given and granted and by these presents doth grant unto the said
 Thomas Hudson his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel
 of Land wheresoever the said Thomas Hudson now lives being a tract
 of Land of 1300 acrs conveyed to Ezekiel Hudson by Samuel Earle
 the 3rd day of January 1818 and a part of an adjoining tract of
 Land of 80 acrs conveyed to Ezekiel Hudson by James Davis
 the 10th day of September 1792 having such papers and forms as are
 further explicated by plats and deeds that are in the possession
 of the said Thomas Hudson with a reserved Right of the
 said premises to the said Ezekiel Hudson during his natural
 life and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and
 assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular
 the said premises unto the said Thomas Hudson his heirs
 and assigns against all claims that now is and against
 every person whoansoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same
 or any part thereof Witness my hand and seal this tenth
 day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty
 six and in the sixteenth year of the Independence of the
 United States of America Signed Seal and Acknowledged
