 Brown (1803) one from street Thuroston dated 30 day of October 1836
 for two hundred and twenty ~~four~~ ~~and~~ ~~one~~ ~~acre~~ ~~and~~ ~~one~~ ~~fourth~~
 David Johnson dated 7 day of Dec 1837 for one hundred and
 twenty acres & one from Charles Bruce dated 13 January 1838
 for two small fractions containing nearly two and a half
 acres the whole containing about three hundred Eighty five
 and a half acres more or less for a more particular reference see
 see and made by John E. Brown to the said P. E. Duncan
 unto the seventh day of November Eighteen hundred and forty
 one and bounded as follows beginning at a sweet gum on the south
 bank of the river thence south 3¹/₂ W 34 with Cleland's line to
 a stake corner on the bank of the crude thence to a red oak corner
 continuing a straight line thence to a hickory corner on the east line
 thence south 18¹/₂ on Cleland's line to a stake thence S 56 W 9 to spine
 thence N 63 W to 20 to spine thence N 66¹/₄ W 12.50 to a black oak
 thence N 56¹/₄ W 12.50 to a black oak thence N 56¹/₄ W 12.50 to a black oak
 thence N 34¹/₂ W 16.40 to a chestnut thence S 55 W 1.40 to a sweet gum
 thence N 95 W 2 to a white oak thence N 36 W 12 up the hollow
 valley straight to a white oak thence S 87 W to a hickory corner
 thence N 4 W 3 to stone corner thence S 87 W 3.50 to a stone corner
 thence N 4 W 2.91 to a black oak corner on the main Road thence
 S 69¹/₂ W along the said road 150 to a pine thence N 4 W to a white oak
 to the head of the Branch thence down the meadows of the Branch
 nearly to the river but striking the river slope above the mouth of the
 Branch thence down the meadows of the River to the beginning
 corner - Together with all and singular rights Members hereditaments
 and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise
 incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular
 the premises before mentioned unto the said Wesley Gibreath his
 heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs
 Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all
 and singular the said premises unto the said Wesley Gibreath
 his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against all
 other persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part
 thereof witness my hand and seal this the nineteenth day of
 July in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and
 thirty six and in the sixty first year of the Independence
 of the united states of America.
