aforesaid, for the sum of ten Dollars and fifty cents paid by Joseph Goodjoin
of the District and State aforesaid. Have granted, bargained sold and
released unto the said Goodjoin a tract or parcel of Land in said District
containing Three Acres and eighty five rods be the same more or less on
the head Waters of Denny Creek of Reedy river, being a part of a tract of
land granted to James Alexander on the second day of December one thou
sand seven hundred and ninety nine by his Excellency Edward Rutledge
the then Governor of the State aforesaid, beginning on a Stake 3x on James
Alexander Esqrs and running forty five Rods to a pine 3x Thence twelve
Rods and a half to John H Harrison's line to a pine 3x thence forty five
Rods on the said Harrison's line to a white Oak 3x thence to the beginning
Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and Ap
pointances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertain
ing) To have and to hold the said premises as before described unto the said
Joseph Goodjoin, his heirs, or assigns for ever and I do hereby bind
myself, my heirs, Administrators or Executors, to warrant and for ever
defend the same as above mentioned, to him the said Goodjoin against myself
my heirs or assigns, and against every other person lawfully claiming
the same, or any part thereof In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 4 day of November 1833. Aquilla Bradsher (Seal)
