Greenville District 3 and Robert Cox of the District and state aforesaid for and  
in consideration of the sum of four hundred Dollars to us paid by Leroy Newby  
of the same state and district aforesaid HAVE granted, bargained sold & released  
and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Leroy  
Newby, his heirs, and assigns forever all that tract of Land situate in  
said District, on the waters of Saluda and Enoree Rivers, and known by  
the name of the Blue ball tract, containing by a late survey five hun  
dred and twelve Acres be the same more or less, and having such bound marks  
as follow, viz/ Beginning at a W O 3x thence N 33 W 10.60 Ch to a  
O. sappling 3x thence N 42 E 15.50 Ch to a W. O. 3x thence N 35 E 27  
Hickory 3x thence N 70 E 22.20 to a chestnut 3x thence N 65 E 11 Ch to  
a dead Hickory 3x, thence S. 36. E 17 Ch to the head of a branch, thence down  
the meanders of said branch to a Gum 3x at the fork at a creek, thence S 12  
Ch to a Gum 3x on another branch, thence up the meanders of said  
branch to the head thereof, thence S 4 W 70 Ch to a chestnut sapling 3x  
thence S. 63. W. 4.50 Ch to a chestnut 3x thence South 34 W. 6.50 Ch to a pine 3x
