Oak and running thence N. 65. E. 32. chains to a Red Oak then
N. 5. W. 1. Ch. 50 rods to a Red Oak thence N. 45. W. 9. Chs to a Creek
at the mouth of a Branch on the North Side thence thence
up the various meanders of the branch to a chestnut thence
N. 65. E. 8° Ch. 50 rods to a Black Oak M. Collier's corner thence
thence west his line S. 65. E. 15. Chs to a Red Oak John Hickman
corner thence with his line S. 17. E. 03. Chs to a Black Oak, crossing
White corner thence with his line a S. W. corner crossing the Creek
to the beginning containing by estimation one hundred and
some acres more or less being part of two tracts the lower
tract supposed to contain fifty acres granted to John
Garrow by patent bearing date October 13rd 1791. the upper
part granted by patent to William Clayton bearing date May
6th 1793. Supposed to contain "50" acres including the in
proments where John Malden used to live together with
all and singular the right members hereditaments and appur
tenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise ap
pertaining to have and to hold all and singular the
possessions before mentioned unto the said Porter and I do
hereby bind myself my heirs Executors administrators and
spouses to warrant also for ever defend all and singular
the said premises unto the said Porter his heirs Executors
Administrators or spouses against me and my heirs
and against the claim or claims of any other person
or persons whatsoever lawfully claiming the same or
any part thereof in witness whereof I here affix
my hand and seal this 25th day of December 1834.
