

South Carolina & Know all men by these presents, that William Blasingame  
of the District and State aforesaid for and in considera-  
tion of the sum of One hundred and twenty five dollars to me paid by Joseph Christopher  
of the same State and District aforesaid granted, bargained, sold and released  
and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said Joseph Christopher  
his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract, piece or parcel of land, situate  
in said District, on both sides of the Middle Fork of Saluda River containing  
one hundred and sixty acres be the same more or less, it being the tract of  
and formerly owned by Joseph McQuain, and sold by William Blasingame  
Sheriff of said District as the property of said McQuain, and conveyed  
by the said Blasingame, as Sheriff aforesaid, to the said Roland. It being also  
part of a tract of land originally granted to the said Joseph McQuain contain-  
ing two hundred and fifty five acres, bearing date the 2nd day of September  
1816. The part now to be conveyed, being bounded by Capt. G. Cleveland the  
heirs of Samuel Earle and others. Together with all and singular the  
rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises  
belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold  
all and singular the said premises unto the said Joseph Christopher Bishum  
and his heirs for ever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors &  
Administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said  
premises, unto the said Joseph Christopher, his heirs and assigns against myself  
and my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming
