 presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Lewis Rodgers of
 the executors all that black oak plantation of Land situate in the State and District aforesaid
 beginning on a stake corner in the said Rodgers yard, thence N 43° E 34' 10" to a pine stump 3x
 20.832 to a pine stump 3x in a hollow thence N 24.8013 to a stake 3x
 148.24 chs to a black jack (dead) 3x thence S 9.1013 across maple branch
 regular pine stump, thence S 52° W 25 ch across the said Maple branch, also re-
 seeded crop an other branch to a pine corner, thence N 43° W 34.50 to the beginning
 of the stake, Containing by estimation by Surveyor Ninety four acres being a
 part of a tract of land originally granted to James Seaborn by his Excellency
 Thomas Pinckney Esquire in the year 1788 and from him to William Kelly
 Lester and from him to John Butler, and from him to John Blankenship and
 from him to Benjamin Griffeth, and from him to me and from me to the
 aforesaid Lewis Rodgers. for a more particular reference see plat herewith annexed
 together with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and
 appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appur-
 tenancing to have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned
 into the said Lewis Rodgers his Heirs and Assigns forever And I
 do hereby bind myself my Heirs, Executors and Administrators, to warrant
 and defend all and singular the said premises, unto the said Lewis
 Rodgers his Heirs and Assigns, against me and my Heirs
 and against every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming to claim
