Greenville District ³ Willman of the District & State aforesaid for £⁰
in consideration of the sum of Seven Pounds Dollars, to me paid by W.C.Bewens
of the same state and district aforesaid, have granted, bargained & sold
and released, and by these presents, do grant bargain, sell release unto
the said W.C.Bewens his heirs and assigns for ever a certain tract of land
situate in said District on the south fork of Brushy creek of Meadow River
containing One acre, it being part of a tract of land sold by Meadow & H.C.Bee
lone and has such boundary as follows, Beginning on a sweetgum on the
south side of Brush creek which is the corner between H.C.Bee and
W.C.Bewens and runs North 72 degrees East Nine rods 84 links to a sweetgum
3 and thence South 34. E 42 rods to a spanish Oak sapling 34, thence
South 25 West 10 rods, to a white Oak 34 on Brush Creek, thence up
Brush Creek to the beginning. Together with all & singular the rights members &
incidents and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging or in any
wise incident of appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises
aforesaid unto the the aforesaid W.C.Bewens, his heirs and assigns for ever and I do
hereby bind myself, my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant & forever defend
all and singular the said premises unto the said W.C.Bewens his heirs and assigns against myself
& my heirs and against every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same in any part
