and release unto the said Joseph N. Melch a tract of Land containing One Hundred Acres more
or less being the tract of Land granted to George Melch. containing 48 Acres & part of the 337
Acre tract granted to Caleb Kimball and conveyed to George Melch. & recorded in the Clerks
Office of Greenville District in Book G. Page 145 granted to said Caleb Kimball by his Exce-
-cellency Andrew Banderhoest bearing date the fourth day of July A.D. 1796 lying on
branches of Rabun Creek of Needy River and Durbin Creek of Enoree River recorded in grant
-at book O. N. 5 page 484 Beginning at a Stake thence S. 73. E. 57 to a Red oak thence S. 12. E. 7 to
a Stake thence S. 63. W. 44. 00 to a Stake thence N. 19. 00 to a Pine thence from the beginning S. 10. E. 24
back to said Pine. The aforesaid 48 Acres Tract being granted to George Melch. by his Exce-
-lency John Drayton the first day of April A.D. 1802 in the District of Greenville on the
head of a small branch the waters of Needy River conveyed to Daniel Melch. together with
all their rights, Hereditaments, Appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertain-
-ing to have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Joseph
N. Melch his Heirs Administrators and Assigns forever and I Daniel Daniel do hereby bind my-
-self my Heirs Administrators and Assigns to warrant and forever defend unto the said
Joseph N. Melch his Heirs and Assigns the premises above mentioned against myself
and my Heirs and against every other person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any
part thereof Witness My hand and seal this 1st day of November 1833
