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Greenville District. This indenture made this 24th day of August
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty
four between John Watson ordinary of Greenville District aforesaid
and Theron Earle of Spartanburg district and David Henning
of Greenville district in the State aforesaid.

Whereas a summons in partition to divide or sell a certain
lot of land hereinafter described of the estate of D. Dennis
Marshall deceased issued from the court of ordinary of said dist-
rict and upon the return thereof, the judge of said court did
determine that the said lot of land could not be divided with-
out injury to the interests of the parties and did order the same
to be sold by the sheriff of the district aforesaid on a credit of one
or two years. Whereupon the sheriff aforesaid did advertise the
said lot of land for sale on the first Monday in July of the
present year. And whereas the sheriff aforesaid did on the said
day expose to sale at public outcry, on the credit aforesaid the
said lot of land, when the said Theron Earle and the said
David Henning was the last and highest bidder, to whom the
said lot of land was struck off for the sum of seventeen hundred
and seventy eight dollars. Now this indenture witnesseth that
in consideration of the sum of seventeen hundred and seventy eight
dollars to me paid or secured to be paid, I have granted bargained
sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain
sell and release to the said Theron Earle and the said
David Henning and their heirs and assigns forever all that
lot of land situate in the town of Greenville in the district
of Greenville it being a part of lot No. 20 known and designated
in the plan of said town and bounded as follows viz
beginning at a stake at the intersection of Main and Coffee
streets on the east side of Main street thence on Coffee street
 $S^{\circ} 74^{\prime} E. 324$ feet to Brown street thence on Brown street $S^{\circ} 16' W.$
60 feet to a stake thence $N. 74^{\circ} W. 224$ feet to a stake on Main street
thence on Main street $N. 16^{\circ} E. 60$ feet to the beginning it being the
lot of land formerly owned by David Garner afterwards by
Edward Croft Esq^r conveyed by the said Croft to the said
deceased with the appurtenances thereto belonging and all
the estate right title interest claim or demand which the said
Dennis Marshall deceased at the time of his death had in or
