of the district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released
and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the
said Charles F. B. Shehane seventy five acres of land more or less
lying in Greenville District on a branch of Needy River known by
the name of the pigeon Roost part of which was granted to
Hance Black and part to John Pyle, so the said seventy five
acres of land is laid out as follows beginning on the Branch on
