The State of South Carolina. Know all men by these Presents  
that I Philip Evans of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid in  
consideration, as well of the natural love and affection for my son William  
H. Evans as the sum of Ten dollars to me in hand paid by the said  
William H. Evans the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged.  
Have granted, bargained, sold, given, released, and conveyed and by  
these Presents do bargain, grant, sell, give release and convey unto  
the said William H. Evans his Heirs and assigns forever all that  
plantation or tract of land situate lying and being in the District  
of Greenville and State aforesaid on the Golden Grove Creek Waters  
of Saluda, containing Eight hundred and fifty seven acres more or  
less being parts of three surveys, and all the Land I now own in  
the said District, and for a more particular description of the land  
hereby conveyed reference must be had to the Title Deeds and papers  
by which the same tracts are conveyed to me and excepting in this deed  
all such pieces of land as I may have heretofore sold off before the  
Execution of this deed. Together with all and singular the members  
Rights, Hereditaments and appurtenances to the same belonging  
or in anywise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all  
and singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said, William  
H. Evans his Heirs and assigns forever - And I do hereby bind myself  
and my Heirs Executors, Administrators and assigns to warrant  
and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said  
William H. Evans his Heirs and assigns against me and my Heirs  
and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming  
or to claim the same or any part thereof.
