about six years of age. To Have & To Hold for the following  
uses & purposes & no other In trust for the sole use and  
benefit of my said grand daughter Elizabeth Earle Smith  
& Mourning Caroline Smith jointly until either arrives at  
the age of thirty one or marries and then the said negro slaves  
above mentioned and their increase to be equally divided and one  
half of the same to be held in trust for the sole use & benefit  
of Elizabeth Earle Smith & the other half for the sole use & benefit  
in trust as aforesaid for Mourning Caroline Smith during  
their lives & no longer & on the death of either of them then her  
part in trust for her children living at her death & should either  
of my said grand daughters above mentioned die without  
children living at her death then her half of the said negro slaves  
& their increase to be held in trust for the benefit of the surviving  
grand daughter above mentioned or if dead for the benefit of her chil-  
dren living at her death. And it is further understood that  
if in the opinion of the said E. J. Smith trustee & myself etc.  
should be thought advisable to sell or swap the girl Mary at any  
time it may be done by the said trustee provided the purchase money  
or the slave taken in exchange be conveyed to my grand daughter  
above mentioned on the same terms and conditions set forth  
in this deed of trust not to other. And I do warrant & forever  
defend the said slaves & their increase to the said E. J. Smith in trust  
for the uses & purposes herein mentioned. Given under my
