South Carolina) Know all men by these presents that I William Edwards of the Greenville District & State aforesaid, for and in Consideration of the sum of One thousand dollars to me in hand paid by George W King of the State of Connecticut and Hartford County the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained sold, and released and by these presents do bargain, sell and release unto the said George W King All that tract or parcel of Land originally granted to Geo Sanders and Thomas Bell the 24 day of September One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty five and being situated all in one plat and regranted the first day of October One thousand Eight hundred and four It being the place wherein I now live Containing Five Hundred acres be the same more or less lying on both sides of the Buncombe Road the waters of Prince Creek and Prince Creek Waters of Enoree River also on the head of Two-hawks Creek waters of Tyger River it being sold by the said George Sanders to the said William Edwards & the said William Edwards to the said George W King Beginning on Post Oak $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence S 35° W 59 chains to Red Oak $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence S 25° E 38 chains to Stake $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence N 68° E 39 chains to Stake $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence due South 40 chains to Post Oak $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence N 39° E 28 chains to Black Jack $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence N 30° E 37 chains to a Poplar $\frac{1}{4}$ m station; thence N 56° W 14 chains to Stake $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence N 35° W 28.75 chains to R Oak $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence N 40° E 5.45 chains $\frac{1}{4}$ m; to Chestnut; thence N 71° E 18.15 chains to Sassafras $\frac{1}{4}$ m. thence N 31° W 18 chains to pine $\frac{1}{4}$ m; thence S 78° W 6 chains to small Chestnut down $\frac{1}{4}$ m. thence S 79° W 39 chains to the beginning Post Oak which contains the land to be conveyed.

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any way incident or appertaining to the same To Have and to Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said George W King his heirs and assigns forever; And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said George W King his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming
