hand & seal this 22<sup>d</sup> December 1840. and in the

To All to Whom These Presents Shall Come, I William M  
Cuddehull Sheriff of Greenville District, and State aforesaid  
send Greeting: Whereas by virtue of sundry Writs of Fieri Facias  
issued out of the Court of Common Pleas, held for the  
District of Greenville One tested the sixteenth day of December  
in the year of our Lords One thousand eight hundred and  
thirty nine at the Suit, of Jeremiah Cleveland, et al.  
to me directed commanding me that of the goods  
and chattels, lands and tenements of John Farr to levy  
the sum of One hundred and Seventy six dollars & 83<sup>1/100</sup>  
damages and costs. I have seized and taken of the  
lands and tenements of the said John Farr all  
that certain piece parcel and tract of land  
containing more or less Four hundred and thirty  
acres, situate and being in the District of Greenville
