borders & boundaries reference is made to a Copy Plat  
annexed to a Copy Grant, certified to be a true copy  
from the original plat on file in the Surveyor Generals  
Office, Columbia the 25<sup>th</sup> November 1839 and signed  
P. H. Saxon Sur. Gen. together with all and singular  
the rights, tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances  
thereunto belonging. To have and to hold the said tract  
of two hundred acres of land, to the same more  
or less unto the said Sion P. Tally his heirs
