Grenville District & that I John Mc Delany for &
in Consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Dollars paid to me in
hand by Daniel Mostoller. I have this day granted bargained sold
& by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said
Daniel Mostoller a certain plantation or parcel of land containing
One Hundred Acres be the same more or less. Beginning on a
lightwood Stake a corner of Gordon Holcombe's land and running
thence W 44 to a Stake thence S 26 E. 51 to a Red Oak thence N 15
E 60 to a pine thence N 30 E. 29. 50 to a Chestnut thence to the
beginning. Together with all and singular the rights members
hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging, & I
do hereby bind myself my Heirs Executors & Administrators
to warrant & forever defend the above mentioned premises
unto the ^{re} Daniel Mostoller, his heirs & assigns forever from
the claims of all persons lawfully claiming the same
or any part thereof in witness whereof I have hereunto
put my hand this twenty fifth day of January One
thousand eight hundred and forty One, signed sealed
and delivered in the presence of us.
