 all men by these presents that I, John Ayres of the District of Greenville and State of South Carolina for and in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by George Morgan of the District and State aforesaid, I have granted and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release and quit of unto the said George Morgan a certain tract of land lying in said District on the South Side of Lawrence River and on the West Side of the Publick Road leading from Greenville Court House to Rushford S. C. and hath such limits and bounding as follows, beginning on a Small Oak <sup>XXX</sup> Running thence N 75 E 12 Chs 50 links to a White Oak <sup>XXX</sup> thence N 12 W along the road 21 Chs to a rock <sup>XXX</sup> thence N 36 W along said road 6 chains 95 links to a Spanish Oak <sup>XXX</sup> thence N 10 W 24 chains to a Spanish Oak <sup>XXX</sup> thence 20 E 13 Chs 60 links to a mulberry <sup>XXX</sup> thence N 40 E 12 Chs 50 links to a Persimmon <sup>XXX</sup> at the head of a branch, thence down the meanders of the said branch 17 Chs to a Stone <sup>XXX</sup> on the old line, thence N 8 W with the old line 2 chains 67 links to a chestnut <sup>XXX</sup> thence N 16 W 12 chains to a poplar <sup>XXX</sup> thence S 70 W 27 Chs to a Stone <sup>XXX</sup> thence South 30 Chs 50 links to a Poplar <sup>XXX</sup> thence S 10 W 30 Chs to a Stone <sup>XXX</sup> thence S 71 E 3 Chs 50 links to a pond oak <sup>XXX</sup> thence S. E. 40 Chs to the beginning corner - also I hereby convey another small piece which I purchased of my brother Reuben Ayres adjoining the above described tract, and which I will wish is beginning at a Stone agreed upon by the said Reuben Ayres and myself John Ayres it being on the west line between the said Reuben Ayres and John Ayres, from thence to a Chestnut <sup>XXX</sup> thence to a Poplar <sup>XXX</sup> on the bank of the branch just above the Spring thence to a persimmon <sup>XXX</sup> on the original line above mentioned thence to the beginning Rock corner containing half an acre be the same more or less which piece or parcel of land was purchased by me for the Spring which we now use, which two pieces above described together contain One Acre and Eighty one acres be the same more or less to have and to hold the above named
