Eliza Webb D'Oyley at the time of her intermarriage with Dr. Theodore G Croft was legally entitled to a distributive share of certain negroes conveyed and settled on one of the subscribers Sarah C D'Oyley, and be it further known that with the consent and approbation of the subscribers hereto, as also with the approbation of the other parties interested therein certain negroes named in a certain marriage settlement made and entered into between Charles W D'Oyley and the said Eliza Webb D'Oyley were given up and delivered unto the said Eliza W D'Oyley as her marriage portion, a moiety of the negroes included and named in the aforesaid marriage settlement the same being her equal and legal portion at the time of her said intermarriage and no more, to wit the following negroes, to wit - Catey and her four children, and Robert & Jane all then being very young and children and not able to make their support, And be it further known that we the subscribers hereto for and in the consideration of the natural affection we have for our daughter Eliza W D'Oyley now the wife of Dr. Theodore G Croft in consideration of the premises and also of Five dollars to us paid we do hereby bind ourselves and our heirs to warrant and guarantee to her and her heirs all and every of the aforesaid negroes and the issue of the females of them forever subject nevertheless to the same trust mentioned in the original deed or marriage settlement between
