 Clark, Both, grant, bargain, sell, and release and confirm, and by these
 presents Both grant, bargain, sell and release and confirm, unto the said
 Isaac F. Alexander, his heirs and assigns forever, the following piece or
 parcel of Land, To Wit, lying and being in the District and State aforesaid
 containing One acre of land, bounded as follows, Beginning at a pine
 stump in the edge of the mill road near the said Alexander's house and
 running with James McKenzie's line 26 rods to a Black Oak corner,
 thence 24 rods to a Black Oak on the side of the mill road, thence with
 the said road 14 rods to the beginning, Witnesseth, the said John H.
 Clark both warrant and defend the rights of said land from all other
 persons, Witnesseth, my hand & Seal this the 7th Day of January 1838

 on which James Seaborn deceased lived at the time his death and was
 set apart by the court of Common Pleas to Mary Seaborn the widow
