The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I Joseph McCullough of Greenville District and State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred and fifty seven and ²⁴/₁₀₀ dollars to me paid by William Mears of the same State and District aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Mears two small tracts or parcels of Land the first beginning at a stake 3x and running thence S 62 W 31.40. to a Black Oak 3x bounded by Ann Shumates land. thence N 75. W 10.75. to a P O 3x. thence N 60. W 13 to a Red Oak 3x bounded by the said McCulloughs land, thence S 67 E. 6.25 to a Red Oak 3x. thence N 28 E. 19.00 to a Hickory 3x thence N 51. E 7.30 to a White Oak 3x on a small branch thence down the meanders of said branch to another large branch thence down the meanders of said branch to the mouth of Ann Shumates Spring branch thence up said branch to the beginning corner The other tract beginning on Hickory 3x and running thence S 12 W 8.16 to a Hickory 3x. thence S 58 E 13.50 to a stake 3x thence N 30. W 16.30 to the beginning corner.
