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Now all men by these presents, that I, Thomas Taylor, of the State and District aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and twenty five dollars to me in hand paid by William McCauble, of the same State and District, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said W. McCauble, all that tract or parcel of land situate in the District and State aforesaid, on Lick Creek, and branches of the same waters of Enoree River, containing one hundred and nine-teen acres be the same more or less. Beginning at White Oak 3x on or near the bank of Lick Creek running up the meanders of the Creek to the fork thence up the west spring of said Creek to a white oak 3x on John Keller's line thence N. 54 1/2 W. 14.00 chs. Spanish oak 3x originally a pine thence N. 59 3/4 W. 26.25 chs. to a Chesnut 3x on Hearper's line thence S. 13 1/2 W. 9.40 chs. to a pine, 3x thence S. 29 E. 48.70 chs. to a post oak 3x thence N. 78 E. 21.75 chs. to the beginning, White Oak. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining). To have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said W. McCauble his heirs and assigns forever I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said W. McCauble against myself, my heirs and against every other person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
