Whereas, The General Assembly of the State afore-
said, on the nineteenth day of December, in the year of our
Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, ratified an
Act, entitled, "An Act to authorize the Superintendents of
Public Works, to dispose of certain lands belonging to the State,"
by which Act, the said Superintendent is authorized and di-
