Shumate, was the last and highest bidder, to whom the said land was struck off, for the sum of four hundred and one dollars. Now this indenture witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of four hundred and one dollars, to me paid and secured to be paid, I have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said Lewis H.C. Shumate and his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract of land situate in the district and State aforesaid in the waters of Horse Creek adjoining lands of Mrs. Chandler Robert Scott and others, it being parts of two original grants to Charles Sullivan, and Benjamin Arnold, and conveyed to said deceased by Elijah Bennett the 3rd day of October A.D. 1801. The tract now conveyed contains two hundred and ten acres (more or less) with the appurtenances thereto belonging, and all the estate, right, title, interest, claim or demand which the said Yenus Rice deceased, at the time of his death had in or to the same. To have and to hold the said tract of land together with all and singular the premises, improvements and appurtenances to the said Lewis H.C. Shumate and his heirs and assigns forever.
