




To have and to hold the above mentioned premises unto the said John Hawkins his heirs and assigns for ever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs or Executors to warrant and for ever defend the above mentioned premises unto the said John Hawkins his heirs and assigns myself my heirs, and against every other persons or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, This thirtieth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty seven.


