by John P. Shockley of the same State and District the receipt whereof I  
have acknowledged Have granted bargain, sold and released and by these  
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said John P. Shockley  
all that piece or parcel of Land situate in the District of Greenville on  
Brushy Creek western of Snowe river, Beginning on a B. Gum 3X 3X on  
The right Bank of Brushy Creek and runs thence S. 53 E. 1/2 Chain to  
an Ash 3X 3X in Branch in an old field; thence N 85 1/2 E. 14.53  
Chains, to a Pine 3X 3X 3X old mark, thence N. 50. E. 2.70 chs to  
R. C. Station, thence N. 46. E. 4.25. chs. to a poplar 3X. 3X on a branch  
thence N. 28. E. 9.15 chs. to a R. C. 3X. 3X, thence N. 37. W. 7.55. chs  
to a Stake, thence S. 55. W. 14.70 chs to a Pine Stump corner of old field  
thence N 37 1/2 West 14.80 chs to B. Gum. 3X on creek, thence up meander  
of said Brushy Creek to the Beginning Black Gum, containing eighty  
acres more or less together with all and singular the rights, tenures,  
incumbrances and appurtenances that belonging or in any wise, incident or  
appurtenant to have to hold and singular the premises, before mentioned unto the  
said John P. Shockley his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself and my  
heirs, executors and Administrators to warrant and ever defend all and singular the said  
premises, unto the said John P. Shockley his heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs  
and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same
