 shall come. I Theodore G. Bright of  
 Greenville in the State aforesaid do say

Greeting Whereas I the said Theodore G. Bright by an annuity Bond executed  
 at even date with these presents have become bound to Edward Bright in the sum of  
 Forty Thousand Dollars conditioned for the payment of an annuity of a clear  
 yearly sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars for the year 1849 to the said Edward  
 Bright and the annual sum of Twenty Dollars for each subsequent year of his  
 life and if he shall die prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> January 1852 then for the payment of four-  
 teen hundred dollars per annum up to that date the said annuities payable  
 on each first March succeeding then annual according to the terms and stipu-  
 lations of said annuity Bond.

Now Whereas That I the said Theodore G. Bright  
 for the better securing the payment of the said sum of the annuities as aforesaid unto  
 the said Edward Bright his heirs executors Administrators or assigns together with  
 lawful interest for the same I have bargained and sold and by these Presents I do  
 bargain and sell and in plain and open market deliver unto the said Edward Bright  
 Twenty five Slaves To wit Fanny, Robert, S. L., Zack, Nick, Edward, Rasmus  
 Sue and his wife Mary, Maud, Sailor, Green, Mary Ely and two other chil-  
 dren Jacob, Israel, and an infant Forty Jacob Sanford, Maud Green, Simon Peter  
 Maria, daughter of Green and Henry

To have and to hold the said Twenty five Slaves aforesaid  
 unto the said Edward Bright his heirs executors administrators and assigns forever  
 Provided always nevertheless That if the said Theodore G. Bright his heirs executors  
 administrators or assigns shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto  
 the said Edward Bright his certain attorney executors administrators or assigns the  
 full and just sum of the annuities aforesaid according to the true intent and meaning
