South Carolina } Know all men by these presents
 Greenville District } That I Stephen H. Wood
 of Pontotoc County in the State of Mississippi
 for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred

Dollars to me paid by A. B. McGilvary of Greenville District in the State aforesaid have
 granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and
 release unto the said A. B. McGilvary all my interest or right or title in that plantation
 a tract of Land situated being and lying in Greenville District and State of
 South Carolina on the road leading to Wilson Ferry about seven miles from Greenville
 Court House being the same tract whereof Stephen Hollenay deceased formerly bore and
 owned when he died. The said Land was devised in the last will and Testament of the said Stephen
 Hollenay as follows I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Nancy Hollenay
 during her natural life the whole of my Lands and plantation which I may die possessed
 of to be fully possessed by her and at her death the one half of said Lands to go to my
 daughter Mary Maria Hollenay and the other half to be at the disposal of my said wife
 in any manner she may think proper This is my will that should my said daughter
 Mary Maria die leaving no valid heirs the same in that case the portion herein given
 to her to go to my surviving children a child to this and if this should be no surviving
 child or children the said portion to go to my son Stephen H. Wood of Malama Whig
 the said daughter Mary Maria Hollenay has died and in consequence of her death the said
 Stephen H. Wood became entitler to her share of the said Land in compliance with
 the requisitions of said will.

Together with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments
 and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining
 To have and to hold all and singular the Premises before mentioned unto
 the said A. B. McGilvary and Nancy McGilvary (late Nancy Hollenay) their Heirs
 and assigns against me and my Heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully
 claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

Witness my Hand and Seal this Third day of January in the
 year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Fifty and in Seventy Years the
 year of the Independence of the United States of America.
