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David Blythe To Hugh Potts	Died 236 Acres	State of South Carolina This Indemnity made Greenville District the 29 th day of March in the year of Our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and forty one between David Blythe Executor of the
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Estate of Jonathan Potts deceased on the one part and Hugh Potts on the other parties of the District and State aforesaid Metinswile that whereas the said Jonathan deceased died by his last will and Testament bearing date the 30th day of July A.D. 1839 did make a sale to be made by his executor of his Lands with other property in pursuance of the requisition in the said will the executor aforesaid did duly advertise the tract of Land on which the said deceased lived at the time of his death to be sold at Greenville Court House in the District aforesaid on the fifth day of January A.D. 1841 it being all that tract of Land sold and conveyed by Thomas Young to the said deceased by deed bearing date the 13th day of January A.D. 1809 (exception hundred acres sold by said Deed to his son Parksdale Potts) the balance now to be conveyed containing Two hundred and fifty Acres more or less Situated in said District on the middle Fork of Saluda River a description of which may be seen on a reference to said deed

And whereas the aforesaid David Blythe as executor aforesaid did on the said Fifth day of January 1841 at the Court House Cour of the District aforesaid offer to sell at publick outcry the said Land on a credit of one and Two years when the said Hugh Potts was the last and highest bidder to whom the said land was struck off for the sum of Seven Hundred and Seventy Six Dollars and 80 cents

Now be it Known by all men that for and in consideration of the sum of Seven Hundred and Seventy Six dollars and 80 cents to the said David Blythe paid or secured to be paid to the said David Blythe as executor aforesaid he aforesaid bargained sold and released and by these presents to do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Hugh Potts his heirs and assigns forever the tract of Land herein before described Together with all and singular the rights members tenements and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to them and to hold all and singular the said premises to him his heirs and assigns forever Attest David Blythe as executor aforesaid do hereby for the consideration aforesaid sell to and invest in the said Hugh Potts his heirs and assigns forever all the right title interest claim or demand which the said Jonathan Potts deceased at the time of his death had to the premises aforesaid In Testimony whereof I the said David Blythe as executor aforesaid have hereunto set my hand and seal this 29th day of March in the year of Our Lord One thousand four hundred and forty one and Sixty Five year of American Independence
