


William Cunningham Trust	Deed of Trust	South Carolina I know all men by these Greenville District presents that we Clarissa and Henrietta Benson of the District and State of aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and fifty Dollars to us in hand paid by Pleasant a negro man and Slave of Francis Benson the receipt of which said sum of money we hereby acknowledge have bargained sold and delivered and do hereby bargain sell and deliver unto William Cunningham in Trust for the use and purposes herein after specified a certain negro boy named Marshall. The object and purpose of the Trust herein and hereby specified is as follows to wit the said negro boy Marshall shall be conveyed to William Cunningham for the sole use benefit and advantage of the aforesaid negro man Pleasant for and during his natural life and after the death of the aforesaid negro man Pleasant for the sole use and benefit and advantage of the said negro boy Marshall for his natural life And we Clarissa & Henrietta for ourselves our heirs executors and administrators do covenant promise and agree to and with the said William Cunningham herein Trustee aforesaid that we will procure warrant and defend the title of said negro boy Marshall unto the said William Cunningham his executors and administrators from and against every person who shall come
