Harrison his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation or Tract of Land situated and lying in the District of Greenville in the State aforesaid on the North side of Saluda River beginning on a Oak Apple Tree on the bank of the River running Thence N 71° E 1/2 chain to a red oak 3/4 Thence N 19° W 32 chains to a stake 3/4 Thence West 31 chains to the River and Thence down the Meander of the River to the beginning containing Three Hundred Acres more or less being the same Tract conveyed to the said Jeremiah Cleveland by William Blount Sheriff of Greenville District by Deed dated the 5th day of June 1832 as by reference thereto will more fully appear

Together with all and singular the Rights, Members, Accidents, and Appurtenances to the above mentioned premises belonging or any in anywise incident or appertaining To You and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Joseph W. Harrison his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby bind the Heirs of the said Jeremiah Cleveland to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Joseph W. Harrison his heirs and assigns against themselves and their heirs only from claiming the said Tract of Land or any part thereof
