do witness and declare myself my true Executor and Administrator to warrant and give full power  
to a Stake and myself my true Executor and Administrator to warrant and give full power  
to come to the place mentioned previously unto the said Thomas Shockey his heirs and assigns  
Branch or against myself my true Executor and Administrator and against every other  
and will that person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same as my said Branch  
fully appears.
