Charlotte Hightower both of the District and State

State of said State entered into a marriage settlement contract and the said Charlotte
Hightower is seized and possessed of certain real and personal estate To wit one
hundred and sixty five acres of Land lying and being in the District and State
of said State adjoining Lands of John F and William H Hightower and other also the
said State To wit George a Slave by Trade about 30 years old Leah aged about
10 years Caroline aged six years Jack four years old and Jane three months Three
Pair of Oxen, Red Steers and Furniture Two Purses Two Tables (Dining and dressing
room) one creckery and delph ware, One copper and Seven Head of cattle Thirty Head of
Pigs One soul more Thirty Dollars more One thousand pounds of Bacon all the
other utensils and kitchen furniture one clock

Said it covenanted and agreed between the said Mary
Heitman and Charles Hightower before the solemnization of their marriage
that all the Real and personal estate shall be held in Trust for the benefit and
support of the said Charlotte Hightower during her life and at her decease if she
should survive her husband intended then the estate of said Real and personal shall
be divided into the hands of the said Charles Hightower. But in the event the said
Mary Heitman should survive her then she is to have a comfortable and necessary support
of the said Real and personal estate during her life through the hands of the Trustees
