of the other part witnesseth for and in consideration

of the sum of One hundred dollars to me paid by the above named James McElve
before the signing and delivering of these presents and the receipt is fully acknowledged
the said John Bonham do freely bargain and sell unto the said James McElve
a Tract or parcel Land situated in Greenville District and State of South Carolina
on both sides of Vaughan Creek the waters of North Pack or the River and containing
by estimation one hundred & sixteen acres the same more or less being a
part of a Tract of Land originally granted to Charles Cornell March 2nd 1711
two hundred and ninety three and recorded in Books pages Beginning on a
red oak on the sd line running thence to a white oak Thence to a Stake then
S 45° W to a black Gum forming John McNeals line Thence E to a Stake Thence
S 72° E to a Stake Thence S 45° W to a chestnut Stake S 72° E to a pine
Thence W to a Stake Thence W to a white oak Thence W to a pine Thence
down the branch to the main line Thence to the beginning

Together with all the woods waters mines and minerals that
belong or is in manner appertaining to the sd Land to the sd James McElve his heirs
and assigns forever I the sd John Bonham do warrant this Land from me
my heirs and from every person who may lawfully claim the same or any part
thereof On the 4th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand five hundred and
