to these presents de grant bargin sett and release with the said J. S. Heall all  
that Tract of land or parcel of Land being and lying our situated in said District  
in the waters of Muske Creek a branch of South Santee River beginning  
at a rock thence NNE 28 to stake thence SSW 44 to a Rock again thence  
E 26 75 to a Stake thence A 47 E 35 to a Rock again thence A 30 E 10 50 to  
Rock again thence A 43 N 16 to a Rock again thence A 34 West to the beginning  
containing by estimation One Hundred and Twenty Seven and a half acres  
being a part of a tract originally granted to James Waring late and from  
a Head regular chain of title to William Paul and from him to me Philip  
Dalg Esq. I do hereby make myself my heirs executors and Administrators  
hereafter and forever defire all and singular the said premises unto the  
said J. S. Heall his heirs and assigns forever on & against every other person  
containing the same or any part thereof.
