Be it known unto all persons that for sometime past
 unhappy family differences have existed between Darnett Natham and his wife
 Mrs Caroline Natham and still continue to exist and all hope of reconciliation is
 expired and as well to promote the future peace quiet and happiness of both as
 provide for the future maintenance education and advancement of their issue
 we have mutually agreed and do hereby agree in the most solemn form and manner
 hereinafter set forth to separate and apart to dissolve so far as they can the relationship
 that has hitherto existed between them and to acquit discharge and forever release
 each mutually the one to the other all claim in Law and Equity to protection and also
 all right and title in Law or Equity to any property of what nature or kind so-
 ever be it real personal mixed choses in action or future contingencies or expectancies
 except as are hereinafter specified And as well to effect the object desired as to
 provide for the future maintenance and support of the said Mrs Caroline Natham
 the said Darnett Natham has prepared an exhibit as well of his entire estate as
 his liabilities which is hereto annexed Signed by him and dated the 2nd Sept. 1851
 and is taken as part of this deed which shows the net estate after paying his
 debts to be Ten thousand Seven hundred and Sixty two dollars which it is mutually
 agreed by Darnett Natham and Caroline Natham shall be divided and in
 pursuance of the foregoing agreement the said Darnett Natham with the consent
 of the said Caroline Natham in order to give her an equal share with himself
 and children of his estate and to provide for as well as he can the future main-
 tenance and support of the said Caroline Natham and to discharge himself and his
 heirs from hereafter from all and every liability for or on account of the future main-
