inches more or less Beginning on a ridge in said stone Branch of 25 C. & C. chains  
post office stamp is situated on the 3d & 38' Thence S 56 W 44° past along the Grenville rocks  
S. O. a distance of 80' on Golden rock Branch of the River with the various meanders  
and back to the south line of slate Anderson Land is a drift on the south side of  
Branch 38' Thence E 14 N 44° past to a stone Branch nearly a drift course on the hill made  
of slate and sand between us & McC Cunningham line Branch S 96 E 19° back  
to a drift to McGowth's mill cut to a rock cut stamp the corner of McC Cunningham's land  
Thence E 44 E 13 N a chain 38' Thence 40 C. 64° past to a rock cut by river the spring bank  
down the meanders of the Branch to an open cut in the creek 225 C. to a stone Branch  
Branch E 38 C. 13 N an open corner Thence E 35 C. 64° to a corner 38' in a stone Branch the River  
the River with the varying crooks of the River to the beginning corner

Done this with all due singular & the right members their testaments  
& appurtenances to the said James Bellring a in anywise incident or affecting  
the same and to take full and singular the premises before mentioned  
the appurtenances unto the said James Anderson his heirs and assigns forever  
I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to hold and  
own secede all and singular the aforesaid premises unto the said James Anderson  
his heirs assigns against myself my heirs and assigns and against every other  
in that shall taught claim the same or any part thereof

person or persons whomsoever renounce release and forever relinquish unto the within man  
James Anderson his heirs and assigns all his right interest and estate and also  
bright and claim of power of w<sup>m</sup> to all and singular the premises within mentioned  
and released of them under my hand and seal the 25<sup>th</sup> day of July 1848
